

We are delighted to have opened our newest addition to Caragh School this week. We now have a Trim Trail on our Astro. This has balance beams, bridges, swing bridges and a climbing wall, plus much more. A trail of this nature is an excellent addition to break times for the children. Teachers and SNAs can also use it for movement breaks, sensory circuit times and during PE or active breaks from the class. The children know now that they can only use the trail when teacher is with them - and not on the way in or out of school each day. Additions of this nature are only possible through the dedication of our parent body who contribute so generously to our school year on year. Last year our Witch Walk raised €10,000 alone. The parents' council have held a wonderful bingo event at Christmas, and they are now planning a 'Speed Quiz' night in the coming weeks. This proves to be a great night out for Mums & Dads.

The Trail has cost the school €25.000 and with your continued support we will pay this back over the coming years. We cannot thank you enough for the continued support you all show to our school year after year. Every child in our school will benefit from such an addition to school life. We hope you can make it to the quiz night on May 20th. Tickets can be purchased through the

Parents Council - €40 per table.

Standardised Tests

At this time of year in every school in the country, standardised testing is conducted. It is a requirement to carry out these tests in the month of May. 1st class to 6th class will complete Literacy, Numeracy and Spelling tests. Such tests are a snapshot of the children's progress. We use many forms of assessment during the year and this is just one such method. We know how hard the children have worked during the year and are proud of all their efforts.

New Book Scheme

The Department of Education along with the Government have recently announced a new scheme for books for primary schools. This new scheme and funding will pay for all school books, workbooks and copies and a certain amount of stationery. €96 per child has been granted to the school. Over the coming weeks we will purchase books and copies for all the children for next year.

Therefore, there will not be any pressure on families to purchase schoolbooks for next year, and the coming years please God. Of course we welcome this decision. All books will be on a 'rental' basis from now on. They will be given to the children during the year as they need them, should be looked after and returned to the school at the end of the year.

This new grant while very welcome covers schoolbooks and related items only. Schools still have the day to day running costs, photocopying, art supplies, equipment and resources to purchase for the children which is not covered by the scheme. As a result, the school will ask parents for a donation of €60 to cover this expense. This is a reduction from the €90 we have traditionally asked for. Further details of this will issue next month. We will not be sending you a booklist.

Healthy Lunches

On a previous Newsletter we mentioned about Healthy school lunches for all the children. Children should not come to school with bags of sweets, packets of biscuits in their lunch boxes. We fully understand that children may be given some money to spend in the shop. However, some children are visiting the shop before school and buying treats for lunch. We would encourage parents to chat to their children about this and remind them that the visit to the shop should take place after school. We will review our healthy lunch policy at the start of the new school year with a view to discussing this further with the children.

We would also encourage families <u>not</u> to send sweets/treats into school on the day of their child's birthday. Parties and celebrations might take place at the weekend and time does not really allow for the giving out of sweets to children in the class. Again, this is our approach to healthy food in school. We do not want anyone disappointed.

The swallow is one of Ireland's migrating birds. It spends the winter in Africa. From April to October, it lives in Ireland. Swallows usually return to the same nest year after year.







HOSTS WANTED! Spanish Summer School, Naas

I am contacting you as the local Coordinator for the 2023 Concepcionistas Summer School. The annual transnational school has been taking place in Naas for 45 years, bringing over 70 students and their tutors to our town in July of each year. Students (aged 14 – 17) will attend St. Mary's College Monday – Friday.

We are seeking host families in Naas and surrounding áreas (Sallins, Johnstown, Caragh, Clane) for our programme this July, students will arrive on June 30th and depart on July 28th. So what's required of families:

- Collection of student on 30/6 (central location, Naas) & welcome
- Provide breakfast, packed lunch and dinner daily
- Students attend School / excursions 9-5 Monday –
 Saturday
- Payment: €860 (If you can host two students payment will be €1720) – by cheque, last week in July.
