


Aladdin Connect

Parents please note that Caragh NS communicates with you through Aladdin Connect. This is both efficient and cost effective for the school and parents. If you are not connected or are having some difficulty with your connection, please contact the office (office@caraghns.ie).

Connect is used by parents to update personal details, change address/phone information, read school notices, see permission slips, make payments to school, see test results & reports, let the school know the reason for a child being absent, view homework and make return to school declarations after an absence.

If you have downloaded the App, please complete the process and validate you mobile phone number – if you don't validate, the system will continue to text you, which is expensive for the school. Thank you.

Art/Crafts, Equipment & Photocopying 2023/2024

Payment for 2023/2024 can be made securely online through your Aladdin Connect - Payment's page - using a debit or credit card.

Cash & cheque payments can be made at the school office between 9am - 12 noon. Put your payment (or part-payment) in an envelope marked with your child's name & class & the amount in the envelope. Drop the envelope into the school office (or your child can give it to their teacher). A receipt will be issued from the office and sent home. Payments should be paid through the Aladdin payments page. Thank you.

School Crests

Any family that would like to purchase school crests can now do so through the Aladdin payments page. Crests are €5 each. On the <u>payments page</u>: Tick the box beside 'Crests' and enter the total amount of money for the number of crests that you need One crest €5, two crests €10, three crests €15 etc. Cash payments can be made in the office.

When the payment is made online, the crests will be given to your child in school.

6th Class Evening

This year we are asking all 6th class parents to join us in school on **Tuesday 19th Sept at 7:30pm**. This is an important evening talk for parents to set out the coming school year. The 6th class year is a very busy year and this is an important opportunity to discuss the year ahead, the preparation for secondary school, Confirmation, Delphi and much more. Did you know?

Of the nine confirmed species of bats in Ireland seven have been recorded in Kildare. The most common is the Leister Bat – our largest but often seen flying over the fields at dusk. They eat over 1000 insects per night. Great pest control.

Cycling

Healthy Lunches

We operate a Healthy Lunch policy in Caragh school. Our aim with this is to ensure that the children have a nutritious and healthy lunch each day. This helps with their learning and their engagement with school life. We would encourage you to ensure that your child has a sandwich, fruit, veg and a healthy drink. Bottles of Prime containing the actually drink or another drink are not allowed in school. Please do not send sugary foods to school. If children are to purchase lunch in the shop on the way to school then this should be a healthy lunch and not an opportunity to spend money on sugary foods.

Please do not send treats to school on your child's birthday. We are not in a position to hand these out and we do not want your child to be disappointed or upset.

Pupil Insurance

Pupil Insurance is optional and also available to be paid online or at the school office. If you are paying cash, please complete the Application form and put the signed part of the form into the envelope with the payment. The option to sign up for pupil insurance is available only until September 30th Cost is €5.61 for 24/7/365 cover.

Student Council 2023/24

This year will see the 6th student council established in Caragh National School. This year it will consist of children from 4th, 5th and 6th class. The children in these classes are asked to put themselves and their ideas forward for election. We hope to form the new council by the middle of next week. We hope the council will work on behalf of all the children in the school to make our school a great place for all. We also hope to link in with some community initiatives in the village.

Smart Watches

We appreciate that the use of Smart Watches is on the rise not just in our school but in society. However, such watches can be a distraction within the classroom and during the school day. Watches which can take pictures, make a phone call or access the internet are not permitted in school. This is an extension of our mobile phone policy which does not permit phones in school.

Naas Bus

We are delighted that Bus Éireann are now providing an opportunity for a bus collection in the Naas area. The collection point is on the Newbridge Road at the Couty Council offices. Bus departs at 8:25.

In order to get a place on this bus it is necessary to contact Bus Éireann directly and apply for a place on their website.


