


SWIM ROTA 2023 - 2024

School Attendance Reports

Twice each year every school is obliged to submit 'School Attendance Return' to TUSLA the child and family agency. We submit a report at this time of the year based on the attendance from September to December and again at the end of the school year for the period from January to June.

We must notify TUSLA of the list of children over the age of 6 who have missed over 20 school days for any reason during these two periods. The submitted report can be followed up by the Education Welfare Officer and they will ask if the absences were explained. Such explained absences due to illness etc are not a cause for concern. A large number of unexplained absences may lead to further involvement from the Education Welfare Officer. Generally, the report is not something to be concerned about and as a school we fully understand that a child may be absence for a number of very valid reasons. We encourage good attendance, and we know that this can help children settle into school and will really help with their overall attainment in school. Should you have any concerns please contact the school office.

Absence

From time to time children can be at home sick for one reason or another. Generally this might be for a day or two. In these situations, when a child is sick, our school policy is not to provide school work for them to complete at home. The focus should be on getting better and ready to come back to school. Of course if the child is out on a longer term illness we will do our best to support them. Please make contact with the school office and we will arrange what we can.

If some of the boys and girls are going on a family holiday during term time, it is also school policy not to provide work packs or school work to be completed while away on holiday. Again please contact the office if you'd wish to discuss this matter.

When your son or daughter is absent from school, please use Aladdin to fill in the reason or you can send a note into the class teacher explaining the absence.
