School Insurance.

The school offers a link to a **Pupils Personal Accident Insurance policy** every year. This is an optional extra.

This year the pupil insurance cover is being offered by J.F.Dunne Insurances Ltd. The Application form and summary of benefits is attached to this newsletter. The price this year is €5.61 per pupil for 24/7 cover for all activities, including school holidays, and cover starts August 31st, 2023.

Payment can be made through the Aladdin payments page. As soon as you click the option for the insurance cover and pay, this is confirmation of sign-up to the policy and no further paperwork is required. If you choose to pay in cash/cheque, the application form must be downloaded and completed for return to the school, along with your payment.

Closing date for signing up to the policy is September 30th.

As a hectic term draws to a close, we would like to thank the boys and girls who represented their school in a range of Cumann na mBunscol games.


Although not qualifying for the semi-finals our under 11 hurlers and senior girls' footballers acquitted themselves in Div. 1.

Reports & Testing

The end of year reports will be released to parents in the coming days and can be viewed on the Aladdin App. We are very proud of the children this year and how hard they have all worked in school. We are still conscious of the impact Covid has had on the teaching & learning and please keep this in mind when reading the reports.

This year all classes from 1st to 6th completed the Drumcondra Standardised tests. All school complete standardised tests each May and this year we updated some of our tests so that they were more in line with current standards. As a result you may notice a slight change in your child's tests scores. This is to be expected.

Please keep in mind that standardised tests are just a snapshot on a given day of your child's attainment in school. As teachers we are constantly assessing how the children are doing and we are best placed to offer good guidance on their progress each year, as will be explained in the school reports.
