Mary Dunne

Mary Dunne was first appointed as a teacher in Caragh N.S. in 1985 and retired as Principal in August 2019. In the intervening years she held a number of roles within the teaching staff of the school and was appointed as Principal in 2013. The Board of Management wish to record its absolute gratitude to Mary for her dedication to and work in the school throughout her career, in particular, while she held the position as Principal. Mary was fully committed to the school. She was an exemplar in terms of her leadership and management of the school; the best interests of the pupils were central to everything she did within the school. School Ethos

We are an inclusive Catholic school, in the Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin. In co-operation with the clergy, parents and teachers, Catholic children were prepared for the Sacraments of Reconciliation March 30th, First Communion May 12th and Confirmation April 12th. A Christmas carol service was held on December 19th involving pupils from Junior Infants to Sixth Class. The pupils attended mass on as part of Catholic Schools Week. Continuous Professional Development – was organised in the following areas:

- Workshop for teachers on Internet Safety and use of Social Media presented by Zeeko
- February 20th Staff In-service Day This day was presented and facilitated by the staff. It involved presentations from staff on the following areas: Speech and Language, New Language Curriculum, Cil (PE integrated with Gaeilge). The staff worked in groups on the new curriculum facilitated and mentored by their peers.

Testing

- Screening Tests were completed in Junior + Senior Infants.
- NNRIT Non Reading Intelligence testing was conducted in 2nd + 4th classes.
 Standardised Tests
- Standardised Testing in Literacy and Numeracy were completed with classes 1st – 6th.
- Standardised test results in Literacy + Numeracy were reviewed by the board. The board were pleased with the excellent results when compared to national norms
- 86 % of pupils tested scored at or above a sten of 5 on the Drumcondra Literacy test.
- 90 % of pupils scored at or above a sten of 5 on the Sigma T Maths test.

Incidental Visit

The school received an incidental visit from Ms.Lena Ni Dhuinn, an inspector with the DES on Wednesday May 7th. She observed teaching and learning in Senior Infants, Second and Sixth Class. She provided a very positive report, noting that teaching and learning were of a very high standard, excellent practice in all lessons observed. She commented on the respectful and positive rapport and relationships evident among staff and pupils. She noted that the pupils were articulate, confident and used very rich language. The school was found to be compliant with Child Protection Procedures. She suggested three areas for further development:

- Expand very good assessment practices to a whole school level.
- Ensure that School Self Evaluation Action Planning Targets are referenced in planning.
- Afford teachers the opportunity for professional dialogue with colleagues to build on this excellent practice.
